The Surf Coast Shire is experiencing solid population growth; Torquay is one of the fastest growth areas in regional Victoria, while Winchelsea and other areas are also being slated for sustained levels of growth in the coming decades.

An iconic region for tourism, the Surf Coast Shire will need to cater not only to a growing population, but also to regional, national and international visitors. Current aquatic and wellness options are limited, as they are either private, located some kilometres away from main township areas, or outdoor, operating only in the summer months.

An aquatic centre with health and wellness facilities would also be a significant asset to improving health outcomes for the community. Though there is a lower level of sedentary living amongst Surf Coast residents, the two fastest growing groups in the region are young families and older persons, both of which would benefit from additional health and wellness options and who are identified as the primary target users of aquatic facilities.

Council is able to access debt funding in order to go ahead with the proposed development, and will need substantial additional funding from Commonwealth and State Governments to proceed. Council therefore needs to resolve its advocacy priorities in the lead-up to the next Federal Election, and to ensure that, if the aquatic centre is included as an advocacy priority, the reasons for its inclusion stand up to scrutiny in the community.



Surf Coast Shire needs to accurately assess residents' attitudes in relation to the proposed aquatic centre, including priority, support (both for the centre and for accessing funding), perceived benefits and concerns, and the information needs and expectations in relation to communications about the proposed development.

This research allows Surf Coast Shire to understand views of different communities across the Shire taking into account location, demographics, potential usage, and ratepayer propensity to pay extra or special rates in order to fund the proposed development.

Research results provide a comprehensive understanding about residents' views and perceptions of the proposed new aquatic centre, by including different subgroups such as various geographic, demographic and potential user groups.

Research has also specifically assessed the following:

- > Views of different communities across the Shire, noting variance in potential usage;
- > Propensity for different communities to pay additional rates or special charges to fund the Centre;
- > Propensity for different communities to prioritise the Centre above other services or infrastructure;
- The community view about using debt to fund the Centre;
- Support to make application for a rate cap exemption based on the level of support for the Centre.

QUANTITATIVE SURVEY METHODOLOGY

This survey was conducted as a 10 minute telephone survey, in the period of 6th to 13th of August, 2015.

Sample comprises n=600 Surf Coast Shire ratepayers, including n=400 residents and n=200 non-residents. Residents: own a property and live in Surf Coast; Non-residents: own one or more rateable properties in Surf Coast but reside elsewhere.


Ratepayers were randomly selected from the Surf Coast Shire database and the sample interviewed and also weighted post-survey to the special charge zones.

The maximum margin of error on the total ratepayer database sample of n=600 is +/-3.9% at the 95% confidence level; differences of +/-1% for net scores are due to rounding. Blue arrows on charts indicate significantly higher results when compared to the total.

Key findings

- Initial support for the proposed aquatic and health centre is moderate, with 44% of Surf Coast Shire ratepayers saying they at least somewhat support the proposal and 35% opposed. As many are strongly against the proposed centre (24%) as are strongly supportive (23%).
- Support for the proposed aquatic centre declines significantly upon in-principle consideration of increased rates over a 20 year period to pay for the centre. Only 30% of ratepayers support the proposal based on this in-principle consideration, while opposition increases to 65%, with most (52%) strongly opposed.
- Support declines even further when ratepayers are asked if they support the proposal based on the individualised amount of the special charge and rate increase calculated on their specific property location. Only 25% of ratepayers supported the proposal based on their individualised charge, whilst 70% are opposed, 55% strongly so.
- Upon prompting with a range of potential benefits and concerns in relation to the proposed facility, support does recover somewhat, to 37%, but a majority (54%) continue to oppose it. On a considered basis, more (40%) strongly oppose the centre, than support it overall (37%), with ratepayers within a 0-5km radius of the location of the proposed centre delivering the only majority support (51%).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY [CONT'D]

Setting the scene

- Ratepayers rated the performance of Surf Coast Shire relatively well, with the majority giving Council at least good ratings on both community consultation and engagement (52%) and overall performance (51%).
 - Those that rated Council performance as good were more likely to support the building of the proposed centre.
- Awareness of the proposal to build an aquatic centre is high, with 77% of ratepayers saying they know something about the proposal, although most only know 'a little' (59%) rather than 'a lot' (18%).
 - Awareness is higher amongst residents (83%) than non-residents (66%) and also amongst those with properties within 10km of the proposed location.
- There is relatively low awareness of the recommended options for the proposed aquatic centre. The option for a 25 metre indoor pool is the only option with majority awareness.
 - However, awareness of recommended options does not make a significant difference to support for the centre.
- The major source of information about the proposal to build an aquatic and health centre in Torquay is from local newspapers (cited by 60%).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY [CONT'D]

Specific reactions to rate increases

- Based upon consideration of the individualised rate charge, support is higher amongst ratepayers that live within a 10km radius of the proposed centre, even though their rate increases are higher than those living further away.
- The majority (70%) of those that do not support the centre are not willing to pay anything to support the building of the centre. This was significantly higher amongst those in the 20+ km radius area from the proposed centre (84%).

Benefits and concerns

- People appreciate the water safety benefits of the proposed centre, with the centre's potential to promote water safety in the community achieving the highest agreement rate (64%). The role of the centre as a social hub is also received well (60%), whilst majorities also agree it will promote health and wellbeing (57%) and that the growth of Torquay demands that it have such a centre (53%).
- However, there are strong opinions amongst ratepayers that the centre will be an excessive drain on Council financial resources (69% agree with this proposition) and that there are more important financial priorities (63%). Further, most (63%) do not see any benefit for themselves in a new aquatic and health centre and 53% say there are already sufficient resources of this kind throughout the Shire and surrounds.





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

Awareness amongst residents versus non-residents







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


Awareness of recommended options for the proposed aquatic and health centre

Awareness of recommended options and support






REACTIONS TO RATE INCREASES

In-principle attitude to special charge & rate increase Total support – Total oppose = -36







Q5. A new aquatic and health centre in Torquay would promote health and wellbeing in our community, as well as providing social and educational benefits. The estimated cost of the centre is up to 29 million dollars to construct, with an ongoing operational cost of approximately one million dollars per annum. Surf Coast Shire Council would need to take out a loan to build the aquatic and health centre. Grants from Federal and State Governments would pay for some of the cost, but a special charge of between \$20 and \$150 would need to be added to rates bills each year for the next 20 years, set according to the ratepayer's proximity to the centre. Ongoing costs to operate and maintain the centre would require an additional rate increase of approximately \$50 for the average ratepayer. Attitude to individualised charge & rate increase Total support – Total oppose = -45












Reasons to oppose an aquatic and health centre built in Torquay

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




